ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

MAKOL ARIIK DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION

We, the undersigned natural persons being at least eighteen years of age, acting as incorporators under the Utah Non-Profit Corporation and Cooperative Association Act, have adopted the following Articles of Incorporation.

Article I NAME

The name of the corporation is: Makol Ariik Development Foundation ("MADF")

Article II DURATION

The period of duration of MADF shall be perpetual unless the corporation is earlier dissolved in according to law.

Article III PURPOSES OF MADF

- (a) To provide scholarships, fellowships, educational loans, or other educational grants to individuals, particularly to deserving students from Southern Sudan.
- (b) To engage in any and all other lawful purposes, activities and pursuits, which are substantially similar to the foregoing and which are or may hereafter be authorized by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and are consistent with those powers described in the Utah Nonprofit Corporation and Cooperation Association Act, as amended and supplemented, including but not limited to: operation as a charitable organization in lessening the burdens of government, providing relief of the poor and distressed or under-privileged, and promoting social welfare by reducing unemployment through economic development.
- (c) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or to be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered top pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to the corporation and to make payments in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein;
- (d) No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office in (including publishing or distribution of statements) except as authorized under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended; and

(e) The corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

Article IV MEMBER/STOCK

The corporation shall not have any class of members or stock.

Article V BY-LAWS

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation may be set forth in the By-Laws of this corporation as may be adopted or modified from time to time by the board of Trustees.

Article VI TRUSTEES

The number of Trustees of this Corporation shall be four (4) or more, as fixed from time to time by the Trustees of the Corporation. The number of persons constituting the initial Board of Trustees, of the Corporation is four, and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as Trustees until they resign or are replaced are:

Article X DISTRIBUTIONS

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof.

Article XI DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended or supplemented, or shall be distributed to the federal government or to a state or local government for a public purposes. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
